February and 2024 Cumulative Donation Totals to Micah 6 Food Pantry

February / 2024 Cumulative Totals:

Sunshine Produce -- 44 lbs / 194 lbs

Dry Goods & Non-Sunshine Produce -- 58.5 lbs / 140.5 lbs

Produce donations from Sunshine gardens decreased in February, which is not a surprise considering the damage incurred to our gardens by the winter cold fronts. Most of our February donations were greens, which don't weigh very much, so close to 60 pounds of greens is actually pretty good. Also donations of purchased produce and dry goods continued to be strong. Thank you everyone!

Sock Donations:

The sock donations were not quantified, but over the past 3 months many, many sacks of new socks were donated by Sunshine gardeners and delivered to the food pantry. The winter sock drive is now over. Thank you to all of you who donated, your generosity was much appreciated by the Micah 6 Food Pantry clients!

Fresh Produce Donations:

Please consider donating excess harvest or purchased produce to the Micah 6 Food Pantry. Donations of fresh produce may be left in the cool room (south end of the trailer) or in the trailer refrigerator.

Dry Goods Donations:

Please consider donating non-perishable food items. Leave your donations in the cool room at the south end of the trailer.

Non-perishable donation suggestions:

Canned meats such as tuna and stew (pop-up tops preferred)

Canned vegetables and soup

Dry beans and rice

Healthy cereals

Peanut butter

Packaged milk and juice that requires no refrigeration

Delivery to the food bank is once a week at this time of year. -- Saturdays at 9am (except March 2nd, Sunshine Plant Sale date).










Maps of the 2024 layout of the two tomato tents, showing where each variety will be located.




About Hoses The garden re

The garden replaces the water pipes and brass taps but not any splitters or hoses. Those are the responsibility of the gardeners, not SCG the governing body over the garden. See the <u>SCG Site Rules</u> page 19; "SCG

maintains plumbing at the water stations, but the members must supply hoses. Be sure to keep hoses out of the paths to prevent tripping hazards. When hoses are not being used, they should be rolled in the plots or hung on the racks."

When purchasing new hoses and splitters, please, only buy hoses and splitters with brass fittings. If you use a hose or splitter with aluminum fittings it will fuse to our brass taps. Please read this article about brass and aluminum incompatibility. When attaching the hoses and splitters I recommend using a bit of teflon tape between all the threaded fittings for a leak-proof connection.

More grass than garden?

Please clean up your plot. If you have health issues that are keeping you from working on your plot contact your Zone Coordinator or the Vice President for assistance. Also, if you'd like to fallow your plot for the rest

of the summer, posted below is how to do that (taken from page 28 of the Handbook). Please make sure your Zone Coordinator or Vice President knows you are fallowing your plot.

Fallow Season or Cover Crop

Occasionally, members may choose to leave a plot fallow for a season. This is a good practice to provide the soil a break. Fallow plots should be cleared of plants and weeds, then covered completely with compost and then cardboard, a thick layer of leaves, or other material that allows water to permeate. Avoid using plastic as it creates a good environment for fire ants underneath, and water pools on top. An alternative to a fallow season is to plant a cover crop to serve as green manure; this can be turned under at the end of the season to condition the soil. Consult the literature or local garden center for details on this technique for soil improvement.
